Services



The DeafHope Children's Program provides a nurturing environment for children survivors of domestic and sexual violence to communicate about violence.

Our weekly art therapy group welcomes both Deaf children and hearing children of Deaf parents to express themselves creatively through verbal or nonverbal means.

In addition, we provide education about domestic and sexual violence through our community outreach services.

The main focus is empowerment and education of children survivors to reduce the stigma and shame of domestic violence.

access to immediate assistance for Deaf survivors by email

Art Therapy

group art therapy, family art therapy, and one-to-one counseling, for Deaf children and hearing kids of deaf adults (KODAs)

Youth Advocacy

support for children survivors to advocate on their behalf for their safety and developmental needs

Systems Advocacy

access to resources such as educational supports and community mental health counseling, referral to other necessary services

School Visits

workshops to educate Deaf students about domestic and sexual violence, and projects that engage the students in constructive activism regarding violence in our community

Community Education

workshops and events to increase awareness about impact of domestic and sexual violence on children

Technical Assistance

training for organizations, civil and criminal justice professionals, and others to enhance services for Deaf children and hearing KODA survivors, using a cultural model of deafness

Resource Center

information about establishing children's program, and information about legal, interpreting, and advocacy issues impacting children survivors
